



2015 Program Highlights

- Supported over 30 functionally disabled residents and older adults by providing a community that supports their independence.
- Opened a new Men's Home in October 2014, fully occupied by Jan. 2015
- Served over 40 campers, including JV residents and other members of the community with disabilities, through Camp Connect sponsored by Concordia Lutheran Church.
- Celebrated a 10-year strong partnership with the Evansville Otters as they hosted another exhibition game in Jacob's Village honor.
- Engaged over 300 volunteers through the work of special events, community projects and resident support services
- Established new partnership with USI students and volunteers who join activities with residents at both JV and at USI campus. Also initiated an internship program at JV.
- Completed needed outside gathering space thanks to private donations and grant support from Posey County Community Foundation and Anchor Industries.

Jacob's Village Provides a Loving Solution for Caregivers

Did you know?....

- 65.7 million caregivers make up 29% of the U.S. adult population providing care to someone who is disabled, ill or aged.
[The National Alliance for Caregiving and AARP, Caregiving in the U.S. National Alliance for Caregiving. Washington, DC.] – Nov. 2012
- Families are still the primary caregivers for adults with developmental disabilities and are themselves aging. Approximately, 76% of individuals with developmental disabilities live at home and in 25% of these homes, the family caregiver was over age 60. Of these households, the average age of the individual with a developmental disability was 38.
