## A New Chapter

In looking back over our 10+ year history, I am so pleased to see the progress made at Jacob's Village. Our growing neighborhood community now includes 30 people who live in our 16 residential homes and apartments. Our residents enjoy a beautiful, safe, walkable neighborhood where their unique



needs are understood. Whether someone has a functional disability or is an aging senior, each Jacob's Village resident can access the services and support they need to live independently, enjoy meaningful relationships and participate in community activities they enjoy. We are blessed to have strong partnerships with disability service providers, area councils on aging, and local churches and organizations who enable us to offer a caring, supportive environment for all who call Jacob's Village home.

Given its growth, Jacob's Village reached a point where full-time leadership was needed. Last year, our Board and I worked to identify an individual who could assume the role of Executive Director and lead the organization into its next 10 years. We are so excited that Kathy Knapp joined our organization last October. As Kathy has taken on the dayto-day management of Jacob's Village, I have been transitioning my involvement to focus on long term property development projects. In the role of General Manager of Jacob's Village Properties, I will be working with the Board to identify and evaluate what additional developments at the property site could best be pursued to further our mission. In the near term, we are working to fund a much needed community center. As time goes on, we will be exploring the possibility of adding additional apartments, perhaps another home or two, and even an equine therapy program. I am grateful for the many ways our friends and supporters have enabled Jacob's Village to come this far, and I look forward to continue working on behalf of this wonderful mission with you.
