Individualized Exercise Classes Launched in Community Center

Twice a week, in partnership with the University of Southern Indiana's Kinesiology Department, Jacob's Village hosts an exciting and innovative exercise program in our spacious new community center. Through the program, which is offered at no charge, junior and senior kinesiology students work closely with individual participants to develop an exercise program tailored to that person's abilities and limitations. Even those in wheelchairs are able to take part in the class, and since 3-4 USI students work with one participant, there is plenty of time for personal attention.

The class utilizes specialized chairs, small weights, rubber bands, yoga balls and aerobic steppers to help participants improve their balance, strength, toning and endurance. Walking outside when weather permits, and yoga DVDs are also part of the class. And then there are those "special" exercises: When JV resident Michael H. requested a Richard Simmons video, one of the USI students took time from his busy schedule to find it at the public library and bring it to class, where it was a huge hit.

Class participants are a mix of JV residents, from both our independent living homes and our senior apartments, and individuals from the surrounding west side community. Students are supervised by USI professor Alyssa Weatherholt, and receive class credit for participating in the program, which offers them a "real world" experience that they would otherwise not experience. If the program is successful – and it certainly appears that it is – we hope to expand it in the fall.





This program is the first of many activities planned for the long-anticipated community center. Sunday evening services, "cards and coffee" for area seniors, Bingo, Special Olympics practices, educational speakers, musical groups – are all happening now with many ideas still being generated. Watch this space! There's more to come in the neighborhood!


USI INTERN JOINS JACOB'S VILLAGE THIS SPRING


