JACOB’S VILLAGE AWARDED VALUABLE NAP TAX CREDITS

By making a donation to Jacob’s Village (\$100 or greater), you will be able to utilize Neighborhood Assistance Program Tax Credits - allowing you to get half of your contribution back as a TAX CREDIT on your Indiana taxes next spring, with the option of also claiming the entire gift as a deduction on your itemized federal tax return. Not only will you get a great break on your taxes next April; you’ll provide funding for the agency. This means that your gift will be worth more than twice as much as it actually costs you. Here’s an example: If you give a gift of \$100, you will make a check out to Jacob’s Village for the whole amount. Along with the contribution, you’ll complete some paperwork that we will send into the state on your behalf. Several weeks later, the state will send you a letter that indicates you

have a tax credit for \$50 (or half of whatever you have donated over \$100). That means, when it comes time to pay your state taxes next April, you will pay \$50 less; or if you don’t owe anything, you’ll get \$50 back! If you also file an itemized federal tax return, you can also then claim a deductible contribution of the entire \$100, which will save you even more. So your \$100 gift will actually only cost you \$50 or LESS! What counts as a contribution? Cash, checks, stocks, securities, or certain stationary building materials are permitted contributions. ST. JOSEPH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL HOSTS 11TH ANNUAL HALLOWEEN PARTY

The annual Halloween party hosted for us by the 8th grade class of St. Joseph Elementary School, under the direction of their teacher Mrs. Mary Kay Elpers, just took place for the 11th year in a row! This is a long-standing event that our residents look forward to every year, and this year’s party was no exception!

Jacob’s Village and St. Joseph School have a long and close history. Resident Scott Huck often provides a Disability Awareness Program to the entire St. Joseph student body and in turn, the school invites our residents to watch their fall & spring musicals and plays. Eleven



years ago, Mrs. Elpers suggested that she and her students come to the Village on a Halloween field trip. The trip is an interactive service project for the 8th grade students, and they spend many hours preparing for it. Students paint individual pumpkins for each of our residents, (including those who will be at work or otherwise unable to join us at the party itself) plan games and craft projects, and often prepare for a rousing game of Charades, when they try (not too hard) to stump our residents with their interpretations of characters and events. And of course, no Halloween party would be complete without candy – lots and lots of candy.

Mrs. Elpers is famous for her generosity in giving candy to the winners of the various games, and there is always plenty for everyone to share. And students make sure that our residents who can’t be at the party aren’t left out – they leave behind pumpkins, candy and other reminders to make everyone feel part of the day.



The field trip is also an opportunity for the St. Joseph students to learn a bit about our residents and how they live. They learn about the residents’ daily routines and often have time for a tour of the nature trail, a highlight of their trip. While the party is generally only two hours long, the memories last a lifetime.
